	<b>Objectives</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Offer clinical consultations to SAPA practitioners</li> <li>• Offer psychosocial strategies and potential interdisciplinary and/or multisectoral intervention options</li> <li>• Inform and assist practitioners on the identification, modes of access and use of appropriate resources (legal, public, health and social services, community, etc.)</li> <li>• Inform practitioners of their responsibilities and of the limits of their interventions</li> </ul> <p>NB: complex cases requiring consultation with representatives of several fields of expertise will be referred to the Multisectoral Consultation Team (<i>see description in Appendix 10</i>)</p>
