


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A WORD FROM THE SCIENTIFIC DIRECTORS

It is with pleasure and pride that we present the 2019–2020 report on the research activities from April 1st, 2019 to March 31, 2020, of the Centre for Research and Expertise in Social Gerontology (CREGÉS). We had another very productive year, as shown in this report outlining the main achievements of our members, which included **70** research projects, **53** scientific publications and **230** knowledge transfer and dissemination activities.

We are proud to have organized the **CREGÉS annual conference** in Québec City, a first for the CREGÉS. This event, on the topic of Deaf older adults and those with disabilities, was co-organized with the PSVI (Participation sociale et villes inclusives) research partnership team and the ACT project (Ageing + Communication + Technologies).

In addition, various CREGÉS members were involved in a number of Quebec's Health and Social Service **Ministry Mandates** in 2019–2020, highlighting our team's leadership and expertise.

At the end of the year, CREGÉS welcomed three new university researchers:

- **Julie Beauchamp**, Ph. D. in sexology, was the Area of Expertise Coordinator in Inclusive Aging, Diversity, Health and Well-Being at CREGÉS until December 2019, is now Assistant Professor at Université Laval's Département de psychiatrie et de neurosciences. Her research interests focus on sexual diversity, aging and sexuality, inclusive practices and social participation.
- **Daniel Béland**, Ph.D. in political sociology and a specialist in federalism and social welfare, is a James McGill Professor at McGill University's Department of Political Science and Director of the McGill Institute for the Study of Canada.
- **Marie-Michèle Lord**, Ph. D. in biomedical sciences, is an Associate Professeure at the occupational therapy department of the Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières. Her research interests include the social participation and inclusion of older adults and older workers.





NATIONAL POLICY FOR CAREGIVERS

In April 2019, **Isabelle Van Pevenage** and **Zelda Freitas** presented a profile of inspiring practices for supporting caregivers at the *Journée d'échange CISSS-CIUSSS et Appuis régionaux*.

In May 2019, **Sophie Éthier** and **Isabelle Van Pevenage** organized a symposium on caregiving at ACFAS. The two researchers were then invited, along with **Mélanie Couture** and **Hélène Carbonneau**, to a day of consultation with MSSS experts held on October 1, 2019, as part of the drafting of the first provincial policy for caregivers. It should be noted that **Sophie Éthier** helped create the caregiver component of the CvP Continuum aînés (a virtual community of practice), developed following the government plan "*Un Québec pour tous les âges*."



LONG-TERM CARE POLICY

Since 2018, **Mélanie Couture** and **Hélène Carbonneau** have participated in consultations with the MSSS on different initiatives related to long-term care, including the development of policy.




MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING AND END-OF-LIFE CARE

In August 2019, **Patrick Durivage** was involved as an advisor in consultations on the Institut national de santé publique du Québec's (INSPQ) preliminary results on palliative and end-of-life care indicators. He also continued his work as a member of Quebec's Commission on End-of-Life Care. In this role, he took part in a day-long forum of talks and workshops organized by the MSSS on January 27, 2020, to shed light on the different points of view regarding capacity to consent and eligibility to medical assistance in dying. Finally, Mr. Durivage also led numerous MSSS training sessions on the *Act respecting end-of-life care*.



POPULATION CHANGES

In April 2019, **Yves Carrière** joined the MSSS subcommittee on the impact of population changes on health services.



DROITS ET LIBERTÉS JOURNAL: SPECIAL ISSUE

Titled "***Droits et citoyenneté des aîné-e-s***", the latest issue of the Droits et libertés journal was dedicated to the rights and demands of older adults.

Four of the articles in the issue were written by CREGÉS members on the topics of the social status of aging (**Ignace Olazabal** and **Julien Simard***), LGBT older adults (**Julie Beauchamp**), right to housing (**Julien Simard***) and the isolation of immigrant older adults (**Shari Brotman**).



This year, CREGÉS produced **two** bilingual issues of *Pluralages* magazine, each a post-event publication intended to provide free access to the knowledge shared during the event.



In May 2019, a number of CREGÉS members were involved in **B/OLD: Aging in our city** (organized by the **ACT** project and engAGE: Concordia's Centre for Research on Aging), an event that used a multi-sector, multidisciplinary and intergenerational approach to explore experiences of growing old in Montreal.

In October 2019, several CREGÉS members took part in **Projection: A Week of Dialogue**, which aimed to instigate discussion, break taboos and help participants use the power of their creativity to gain a deeper experience of life and more comfort with the prospect of death.



We uploaded **27** new videos—mainly recordings of our lectures or conference talks—which generated over **3,500** views.




