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# A WORD FROM OUR TEAM

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It is with great pride that we present the report on the research activities from April 1st, 2020 to March 31, 2021, of the Centre for Research and Expertise in Social Gerontology (CREGÉS). Two major events have marked this past year.

To start with, 2020–2021 marked the end of Dr. Patrik Marier's eight-year term as Scientific Director of the CREGÉS. His innovative leadership, rallying spirit, steadfastness and enthusiasm infused the Centre with new vitality. His tireless efforts were instrumental in consolidating and developing our fields of study, expertise and intervention, increasing our influence and impact, and strengthening the ties both within the CREGÉS and between the Centre and its multiple partners in social gerontology. We would like to express our deepest gratitude to Dr. Marier for all he has done.

Secondly, as was the case worldwide, the COVID-19 pandemic had multiple and far-reaching repercussions on the individual, organizational and societal levels, impacts whose final magnitude has yet to be determined. The pandemic drastically changed how we work, throwing numerous obstacles and challenges to the social gerontology research conducted with older adults, caregivers and practitioners. COVID-19 also brought to light new pressing needs, created serious complications for students and called for a high degree of resourcefulness as we sought to adapt our activities to these new constraints and realities. Despite these difficulties, the year proved extremely productive for the CREGÉS, as this report outlining our members' main achievements—which included **109** research projects (70 in 2019–2020), **113** scientific publications (53 in 2019–2020) and **353** knowledge transfer and dissemination activities (123 in 2019–2020)—will make abundantly clear.

As the pandemic continued, the CREGÉS redoubled its efforts and strategies to inform and support workers, practitioners, older adults and caregivers. Among other things, various initiatives and partnerships to develop knowledge and intervention tools have emerged, as have new knowledge transfer tools.

Our sincere thanks and warmest congratulations to our members, collaborators and partners on such a successful year!

Through the Centre for Research and Expertise in Social Gerontology (CREGÉS), the Integrated Health and Social Services University Network (CIUSSS) for West-Central Montreal was designated as a University-Affiliated Centre (UAC) in social gerontology. CREGÉS is funded by the Ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux (MSSS) and the Fonds de recherche du Québec – Société et Culture (FRQSC) under the infrastructure support program for university research centres and institutes.

CREGÉS is a research infrastructure that facilitates the sharing of knowledge and expertise between academic and practice settings. Its purpose is to stimulate, develop and disseminate research in social gerontology, and to support the development of leading-edge, innovative practices.

They are supported by a team of professionals who coordinate CREGÉS's activities, carry out evaluative research and studies, and conduct a knowledge transfer and mobilization program.



## RESEARCH PARTNER TEAMS



**ACT (Ageing + Communication + Technologies):** An international partnership project that aims to create bridges between generations, discover how new media can better meet the needs of older adults, and fight against digital ageism. The ACT project is funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC).



**VIES (Vieillissements, exclusions sociales et solidarités):** A research partner team in critical social gerontology that examines social issues related to aging and notions of social inclusion and exclusion. The VIES team is funded by the Fonds de recherche du Québec – Société et culture (FRQSC).

# SUPPORT FOR RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Composed of representatives elected at the Annual Assembly, the Scientific Committee is mandated to support scientific research. To encourage the next generation of social gerontology research, each year the committee organizes competitions examines the applications received and issues seed funding to new projects in addition to financial assistance for the dissemination and sharing of research results. It also provides scholarships to students who are supervised by CREGÉS regular researchers.

Research activities in 2020–2021 were seriously disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The cancellation of numerous scientific conferences earlier in the year led to the annulment of competitions to support researcher and student participation in such events. To adapt to the situation, the Scientific Committee created two new special competitions: one in the spring, to offer scholarships to students facing uncertainties; the other in the fall, to provide seed funding to researchers.

This year saw our members obtain **42 new research grants** (28 as principal investigator and 14 as co-investigator). These awards join the **64 ongoing grants** and **3 completed grants** during the year, for a total of 109 research grants in 2020–2021.

## RESEARCH AXES

Research at the CREGÉS is in the field of social gerontology, which concerns the social, cultural, political and economic aspects to old age and aging. Not only are the latter complex phenomena, but older adults also constitute an extremely heterogeneous population. Our aim is therefore to gather knowledge and present a multifaceted vision of this population's diversified experience. Our research program is organized around five axes:



# RESEARCH AXES

## AXE 1

### SENIORS AS SOCIAL ACTORS

This research axis aims to build the capacity of older adults in order to foster their resilience and well-being. Seniors are not seen as a clientele to be served, but rather as active participants in the aging process.

## AXIS 2

### HETEROGENEITY OF AGING: BODIES, IDENTITY AND SOCIETY

This research axis aims to put aging stereotypes into perspective, to examine the multiple ways in which people experience and perceive aging, and to explore the many ties between age and living environments.

## AXIS 3

### SERVICE DELIVERY TO SENIORS AND THEIR LOVED ONES

This research axis helps to develop innovative modes of service delivery aimed at supporting and evaluating current practices. Areas of focus include mistreatment, mental health issues, chronic diseases, cognitive aging and palliative care. Services should be aimed not only at clinical recovery, but also at adaptation, integration and the increased participation of older adults.

## AXIS 4

### LIVING ENVIRONMENTS

This research axis takes a critical view of the idealized “home environment” in light of the interpersonal dynamics and rules and regulations that exist in different living environments. The goal is to understand how experiences of aging depend not only on the physical structures in which older adults live, but also on interpersonal exchanges and personal care.

## TRANSVERSAL AXIS

### PUBLIC POLICY IN SOCIAL GERONTOLOGY

This research axis looks at public policy development and knowledge dissemination in order to contribute to public debates in social gerontology. Projects examine the scope, application, independence and sustainability of social gerontology policies, which are often subject to political and socioeconomic factors such as the power of groups representing older adults, differences between social classes, governments' fiscal capacity and policies' long-term structural impacts.

# CONTRIBUTIONS TO PUBLIC PROGRAMS AND POLICIES

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## HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICE MINISTRY (MSSS) MANDATES

The CREGÉS pursued its involvement in the MSSS mandates granted to the CIUSSS for West-Central Montreal due to the CREGÉS's expertise.

### PROVINCIAL POLICY AND TRAINING TO COUNTER THE MISTREATMENT OF OLDER ADULTS

Members of the Domain of Expertise team to counter the mistreatment of older adults oversee a number of ministry mandates, in addition to sitting on numerous local, regional and national committees and working groups and being regularly consulted for their expertise. Two researchers integral to the team are involved in its mandates and activities at differing levels. Furthermore, the Domain of Expertise Coordinator and the project Co-Lead researcher also serve as experts in the ongoing review of the *Act to combat maltreatment of seniors and other persons of full age in vulnerable situations* (CQLR c L-6.3).

In 2020–2021, the Domain of Expertise to Counter Mistreatment team evaluated the development, compliance and rollout of policies implemented in the Quebec-wide health and social services network (RSSS) to counter mistreatment in institutional settings.

To support the *Governmental Action Plan to Counter Mistreatment of Older Adults* 2017–2022, the team also continued to develop training and tools focused on preventing or handling situations of abuse. These are aimed at practitioners, RSSS clinical supervisors and long-term care facility (CHSLD) managers, as well as community and financial sector workers. At present, a number of modules are available through the provincial Environnement numérique d'apprentissage (ENA, digital learning platform), with others soon to follow.

## CONTRIBUTIONS TO PUBLIC PROGRAMS AND POLICIES

The Coordinator and Co-Lead of the Domain of Expertise to Counter Mistreatment also sit on the Montreal steering committee (*Comité d'orientation montréalais de lutte contre la maltraitance envers les personnes aînées*) to implement and follow up on the governmental action plan. In addition, the Domain of Expertise Coordinator sits on the Comité des répondants du dossier maltraitance montréalais, the Comité des répondants du Processus d'intervention concertée (PIC) de Montréal and the steering committee for implementing the governmental action plan in cultural communities. The ministry has also appointed her to a fourth term on the Public Curator Committee (Curateur public Committee) on the Protection and Representation of Incapacitated or Protected Persons.

Lastly, researchers who are on this team oversaw development of two briefs, which involved many of our regular researchers and collaborators as well as various partners. The briefs were presented during the consultations led by the MSSS Secrétariat aux aînés for the renewal of the *Governmental Action Plan to Counter Mistreatment of Older Adults 2022–2027*.

### TRAINING AND TIP SHEET FOR AN INCLUSIVE APPROACH WITH LGBT+ OLDER ADULTS

Under another ministerial mandate, the Domain of Expertise team for Inclusive Aging, Diversity, Health and Well-Being developed a training course on the realities and needs of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Trans (LGBT) older adults. Aimed at all RSSS employees, the training can be accessed on the provincial ENA. A tip sheet for workers and practitioners was also produced to support an inclusive approach toward LGBTQ+ older adults. New training modules to address the needs of LGBTQ+ seniors living with some form of dementia, receiving palliative care or at the end of their lives are currently in development.

### A POLICY FOR LONG-TERM RESIDENTIAL CARE AND SERVICES

Throughout the year, CREGÉS researchers continued to provide expert advice to the MSSS consultations to develop a policy on residential and long-term care and services. Entitled *Des milieux de vie qui nous ressemblent*, the policy was made public on April 15, 2021.

### NATIONAL POLICY FOR CAREGIVERS

In 2020–2021, the Domain of Expertise in Caregiving, which comprises researchers and professionals, completed the mandate entrusted to it by the MSSS. The mandate entailed providing an overview of the services and support measures available to caregivers (including those available to family members in the RSSS); sharing selected best practices; and listing the local, national and international sectoral and cross-sectoral support measures and policies.

Following this, as part of the special consultations and public hearings on Bill 56, *An Act to recognize and support caregivers and to amend various legislative provisions*, our members prepared a brief to present to the Committee on Citizen Relations. Some of our researchers also contributed to the national policy for caregivers, which was made public on April 22, 2021. The CREGÉS received special thanks for the significance of its input to the policy.

## CONTRIBUTIONS TO PUBLIC PROGRAMS AND POLICIES

The Act also established the Quebec Observatory on Caregiving (Observatoire québécois de la proche aidance), whose purpose is to provide reliable and objective information regarding caregiving. CREGÉS members were on the team tasked with developing a draft working plan for the Observatoire.



### MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING, PALLIATIVE AND END-OF-LIFE CARE

Our Domain of Expertise in Palliative Care Coordinator **Patrick Durivage** multiplied his efforts to improve conditions surrounding medical assistance in dying and end-of-life care. Invited to serve as an expert at the MSSS-organized forum on medical assistance in dying and mental health, he also saw his mandate renewed with the Quebec Commission on End-of-Life Care as representative of the professional order of social workers in palliative and end-of-life care.



### SOCIAL GERONTOLOGY AND COVID-19

A CREGÉS researcher was also invited to provide expert input to an MSSS working group on the pandemic-related measures implemented for seniors and caregivers.

Furthermore, in response to the concerns raised by caregivers and community representatives, the CREGÉS released the report *Caregivers of Long-Term Care Residents in the Context of COVID-19: Current Knowledge, Inspiring Practices and Recommendations*. The findings were also presented at a Conférence CREGÉS.

# KNOWLEDGE TRANSFER AND DISSEMINATION ACTIVITIES

The CREGÉS is committed to bridging the gap between research and practice through strategies that make knowledge readily available to different target groups, such as practitioners and managers within the health and social services network (RSSS), community partners, decision-makers or students in social gerontology. The ultimate goal of these strategies—which include **publishing research results** and **organizing specific knowledge transfer and dissemination activities**—is to improve practices.




### COLLECTIVE WORK AND VIDEO SERIES



As part of the International Day for Older Persons on October 1, the CREGÉS announced the launch of the collective work *Getting Wise About Getting Old. Debunking Myths About Aging* (UBC PRESS). Some 60 authors from a range of organizations and disciplines—including a number of CREGÉS researchers and students—contributed to the book's 31 chapters, which set out to paint a far more accurate and nuanced portrait of old age.

This publication is the English version of *Les vieillissements sous la loupe. Entre mythes et réalités* (PUL) released in 2018. Both books are the result of a joint initiative by the Équipe de recherche en partenariat Vieillissements, exclusions sociales et solidarités (VIES) and the CREGÉS.

Ageing + Communication + Technologies (ACT), in association with Équipe VIES and the CREGÉS, also created a series of short bilingual videos in which the book's authors present various topics. Uploaded to our YouTube channel, the **12 videos** had gotten over **700 views** by the end of the year.

Scientific communications presented in conference settings

Due to the pandemic, the scientific conferences organized by member researchers and supported by the CREGÉS, slated to take place at the ACFAS Congress and the Scientific and Educational Meeting of the Canadian Association on Gerontology, were postponed. Similarly, earlier this year the majority of local, national and international scientific congresses were canceled or postponed for a year. However, these types of activity gradually resumed virtually in the months that followed. As a result, our members (researchers and Domain-of-expertise coordinators) were able to present **21 scientific papers**, one at the local level, one at the national level and **19 at the international level**.

## INVOLVEMENT OF CREGÉS DURING COVID-19

The CREGÉS has increased its efforts to inform and **support practitioners, older adults and their caregivers** during COVID-19. Since the beginning of the pandemic, the knowledge transfer team created a webpage listing **scientific publications, media appearances, CREGÉS initiatives and collaborations**, as well as a series of videos.



### CREGÉS COVID-19 INTERVIEWS

This series of videos produced by the CREGÉS explores the social issues linked to aging in a pandemic context. Each led by a CREGÉS researcher, they highlight our **members' expertise, areas of interest and research** in connection with COVID-19.



For the most part, they set out to make the findings published in scientific journals more widely accessible. The CREGÉS also produced complementary infographics for some of the videos. The **7 videos** produced in 2020–2021 were resoundingly successful, generating over **2,100 views** on our YouTube channel.



### INFOGRAPHICS

The **2 infographics**, in turn, got over **500 clicks** in our special newsletters and were widely shared by our partners on social media.

This year the CREGÉS held all its conferences online since the pandemic had rendered the hybrid format impossible. Despite this drawback, **1,186 people** attended the Conférences CREGÉS in 2020–2021, up from **609 the previous year**.

Key success factors here were a more streamlined offer, the sharing of activities by our partners, (CvP Continuum Aînés, engAGE, ACT, L'Appui, IVPSA, RQSPAL, Réseau québécois COVID, etc...) subject matter relevance, engagement on the part of CREGÉS members and **better post-activity follow-up** (shared recordings, presentations, lists of tools and resources).

### SYMPOSIUM IN PARTNERSHIP



#### VIRTUAL SYMPOSIUM ON THE SOCIAL AND HEALTH ISSUES AFFECTING OLDER ADULTS IN THE JUSTICE SYSTEM



The CREGÉS was involved in a virtual symposium consisting of a three-webinar series on the social and health issues affecting older adults in the justice system. We participated extensively in the promotion and oversaw the technical aspects of the events, which **reached over 1,000 participants**. The symposium was organized by Maison Cross Roads and the research partner team VIES (Vieillissements, exclusions sociales et solidarités), in cooperation with the Association des services de réhabilitation sociale du Québec (ASRSQ), the CREGÉS and the virtual practice community CvP Continuum Aînés.
